

Death Of Miss Lillian M^cMahan

Services at 2:30 o'clock
Sunday in the Campbell-Lewis
Chapel; Interment Ridge Park

Miss Margaret Lillian McMahan passed away at 4:15 o'clock yesterday afternoon in the Johnson Nursing Home, 431 East Arrow, where she had been a patient the last two weeks. Prior to going to the nursing home, Miss McMahan had been a patient in the Fitzgibbon hospital. She had been ill two months.

Funeral services will be at 2:30 o'clock Sunday afternoon in the Campbell-Lewis Funeral Home, with the Reverend E. T. Raney officiating, assisted by the Reverend Cecil E. Horner. Interment will be in Ridge Park cemetery. The body will remain at the funeral home through the service.

Miss McMahan, the daughter of William H. C. and Martha Ellen Hawpe McMahan, was born November 25, 1874, in Saline county, 8 miles east of Marshall, in the home her parents had built. Miss McMahan and her sister Miss Kate, occupied this home until 1932, when they had a modern home erected. Being of an unusually timid and retiring disposition, Miss Lillian depended upon her sister for leadership and there was an unusually close tie between them. Unstinted credit is due Miss Kate, who throughout the years, has given her faithful and loving care.

Ardent affection was also given to Miss McMahan by her niece, Mrs. Phil Humphrey. Many thoughtful acts which would bring pleasure to her aunt were extended by Mrs. Humphrey, one of the most pleasurable being when she would take her aunt to visit relatives and to attend meetings or to take drives about the countryside.

Miss McMahan was a member of the Shiloh Methodist church for a number of years.

Surviving are her sister, Miss Mattie Kate McMahan, and a number of nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by three sisters, Mrs. Adella Lawless, Mrs. Mary Lawless and Miss Cora McMahan; four brothers, Harvey McMahan, Ed McMahan, Hawpe McMahan and James McMahan.
