

Death of Harry Narron

Services at 3 o'clock
Wednesday in the Baptist
Church. Interment in Slater.

Harry Francis Narron, 54, was stricken about 1:30 o'clock yesterday afternoon and died immediately from a heart attack at the rear of the Viking Cleaners building. Mr. Narron had been ill for several years.

Funeral services will be at 3 o'clock Wednesday afternoon in the First Baptist church with the Reverend W. J. Oldham officiating. Burial will be in the Slater City cemetery. The body will remain at the Sweeney Funeral Home until taken to the church for the service.

Mr. Narron was born August 29, 1903 south of Marshall, the son of Charles Henry and Cizzie Tomlinson Narron. He was married to Miss Irene Dennis, October 27, 1923. Mr. Narron was a retired farmer and until moving to Marshall had lived north of Marshall. He was a member of the Fairville Baptist church.
