

## C. T. Nelson Dies; Services Thursday

C. T. Nelson, well-known farmer of the Bunceton community, died Tuesday morning at St. Joseph's hospital. He had been in failing health for over a year.

Funeral services will be held at the Bunceton Baptist Church Thursday afternoon at 2 o'clock, with The Rev. Robert Streeter, pastor, officiating. Burial will be in the Bunceton Masonic Cemetery. The Goodman and Boller Funeral Home will be in charge of services.

Clyde Truman Nelson, son of Mr. and Mrs. T. A. Nelson, was born at Eminence farm, the family homestead two miles east of Bunceton, on April 17, 1886, and spent his entire life there. He was educated in the Bunceton public school and at William Jewell college, Liberty, where he joined the Baptist church.

At the time of his death he was a deacon in the Bunceton Baptist Church and was a member of the Bunceton Masonic Lodge.

Mr. Nelson was married to Miss Clara Virginia Harned on June 26, 1918. He is survived by his widow; one son, Thomas Alpheus Nelson of Bunceton; two brothers, A. J. Nelson of Stover, and Edgar C. Nelson of Boonville; and a number of nephews and nieces.
