

An Otterville Man Dies in Truck Crash

OTTERVILLE — An Otterville man was killed Saturday morning when his truck collided with a tractor-trailer rig at the west city limits here on Highway 50.

Killed was Charles H. Jenkins Jr. of Rt. 2, Otterville. Jenkins was driving a pickup truck east on 50 when his truck collided with the larger unit on a rise in the highway a short distance from a curve.

The driver of the other truck was William A. Gossett, 34, of Jonesboro, Ark. He was delivering a trailer load of coops to Marshall when the accident occurred.

Mr. Jenkins is survived by his wife; his mother, Mrs. Mamie Jenkins, and a brother, Burford, all of the Otterville community.
