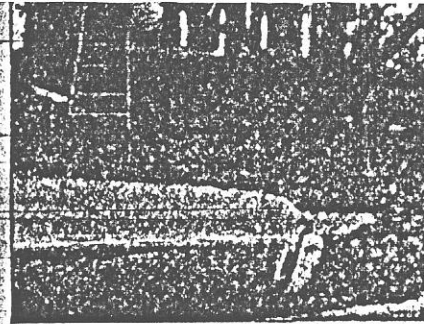
Burial was in the Tipton Masonic Cemetery with graveside services by the Edgar Cole Post.
