Louis Stock, 58, Boonville, died at 4:15 p.m. Wednesday in Cooper County Hospital following an illness of two days. Funeral services will be conducted at the Pleasant Grove Lutheran Church at 2 p.m. Saturday with Rev. David Fechner officiating. Louis William Stock was born at Lupus Jan. 24, 1914, the son of Martin and Emma Michalski Stock. He was married to Lucile Dicht on June 14, 1942 at Pleasant Grove.
