William R. Engle, 87, Boonville, died unexpectedly Thursday night (Feb. 20, 1975) at Cooper County Memorial Hospital following an illness of three weeks. Funeral services will be at 2 p.m. Sunday at the Nelson Memorial Methodist Church. The Rev. Charles Burner will officiate, with burial in Walnut Grove Cemetery.
