Jasper Leroy Hill, 51, of Lamine, died at the University of Missouri Medical Center Sunday afternoon, Aug. 28, 1977 following an illness of one year. Funeral services will be held at 2:30 p.m. Tuesday, Aug. 30, 1977 at the William Wood Funeral Chapel in Boonville. The Rev. Gene Akeman will officiate with burial in Old Lamine Cemetery. ✓

Mr. Hill was born near Lamine, Oct. 11, 1925, the son of Jasper and Mary V. Smith Hill. He had lived in the community his entire life where he was a farmer, stockman and truck driver.

He was a member of the Federated Church in Blackwater. He also was a member of Nelson Masonic Lodge, No. 560, and the Teamster's Union in Kansas City.

He is survived by a sister, Mrs. Sarah Dean Blanck, of Jefferson City, two nieces, Anne Allen and Kay Earls, both of Boonville; two nephews, Carl Blanck of Columbia and Willard Worts of Versailles, one great nephew, two great-nieces, and a brother-in-law, Harold Boehm of Boonville.

He was preceded in death by his parents and a sister, Ida Belle Boehm, who died Oct. 2, 1976.
