Howard V. Weaver, 75, Leawood, Kan., founder and owner of Howard V. Weaver Investments and former owner of the Weaver Airline and Real Estate School, died Wednesday, Oct. 30, at St. Luke's Hospital, Kansas City.

Mr. Weaver and his wife Nadine have donated a total of \$246,116 to Johnson County Memorial Hospital throughout the past 15 years for capital improvements and the purchase of medical equipment. Mrs. Weaver was born and reared in Johnson County.

A \$40,600 donation by the couple helped fund the new Intensive Care Unit at JCMH, formally dedicated in May of this year.

Mr. Weaver was a former chairman of the Greater Kansas City Better Business Bureau and the National Home Study Council. He was a former director of the Red Bridge Mercantile Bank and the United Missouri Bank South.

He was a member of the Scottish Rite bodies, the Ararat Shrine, the Country Club Masonic Lodge, the Kansas City Club, the Leawood Country Club and Missouri Yacht Club.

Mr. Weaver was elected to the Business Schools Hall of Fame, Washington, D.C. He received an honorary doctorate degree from Upper Iowa University, Fayette. He was a Presbyterian.

Mr. Weaver was born in Deepwater and had lived in Leawood, Kan., for 28 years.

Survivors include his wife, Nadine M. Weaver, of the home.

Funeral services will be at 3 p.m. Friday at the Mount Moriah Chapel, Kansas City.
