Elyse Jeanne Saraceni, 20, of Greensburg RD 4 (Salem Township), died Wednesday, Dec. 21, 1988, in the crash of Pan Am Flight 103 in Lockerbie, Scotland. She was born June 1, 1968, in Greensburg, a daughter of Dr. Gene A. and Iva Jean Douth Saraceni.

A 1986 graduate of Greensburg Central Catholic High School, she was a junior majoring in piano at Seton Hill College and had been studying piano performance and musical composition at London's Royal Academy of Music in England. She worked last summer as an apprentice with the Civic Light Opera of Pittsburgh and was awarded a scholarship grant from the Civic Light Opera Guild in November. She was a member of St. Mary Catholic Church of Forbes Road, the Seton Hill College Concert Choir, the West-

moreland County Choral Society, and the Moonlight Riders 4H Club.

In addition to her parents, she is survived by a brother, Christopher, a student at Rochester Institute of Technology; her maternal grandparents, Eugene Russell Hendrix Douth and Mary Jane Patsiga Douth of Beaver; and her paternal grandparents, Adamo and Louise Petrarca Saraceni of Philadelphia.

A Mass of Christian Burial was concelebrated Monday, January 2, in St. Joseph Chapel, Seton Hill College, by the Most Rev. Anthony Bosco, bishop of the Greensburg Diocese, and the Most Rev. William G. Connare, retired bishop of Greensburg. Interment followed in Greensburg Catholic Cemetery, Hempfield Township.
