## Jessie May Nichols, 80

Jessie May Nichols, 80, of Route 1, Otterville, passed away on Sunday, November 29, at Four Seasons Care Center in Sedalia.

Born April 9, 1912, near Otterville, she was the daughter of George and Jessie Mae Homan Wear. She was married on August 9, 1935 in Knob Noster to George Nichols, who survives of the home. She was a member of the Wesley Methodist Church in Sedalia, where she was active in the Womens Fellowship.

Mrs. Nichols was a teacher, who taught in schools in Fayetteville, Smithton, St. Charles, Jefferson City over a period of about 15 years. She retired from teaching in 1961.
