John Doumas, 78

John Doumas, 78, of Louisville, Ky., died Thursday, April 11, 2002 at his home. A memorial service will be held April 13, 2 p.m. at the Chapel of Beargrass Christian Church, Louisville, Ky.

Mr. Doumas was born Aug. 1, 1923 in Granite City, Ill. to Sam and Emma Anz Doumas. He married Betty J. Schoen on Nov. 2, 1946 and she survives. He was a graduate of the University of Cincinnati's School of Architecture. He practiced architecture for more than 50 years and later became the senior partner of Doumas Architects. He was certified by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards. He served honorably in the Army Air Force during WWII and was stationed in the South Pacific. Mr. Doumas was a deacon and past president of the Friendship Class at the Beargrass Christian Church. He served as a vestryman and senior warden for both the St. Matthew's and St. John's Episcopal Churches. In addition he was a trustee for the Morton Church Home. He was an avid tennis player, reader and student of history.

He is survived by his wife Betty; two sons, John R. Doumas of Boonville, Mo. and Mark A. Doumas; four grandchildren and two stepchildren; a sister, Mrs. Floyd K. Bohart.

Leonard E. Stone, 86, of Olean, formerly of Marshall, Mo., died Thursday, April 11, 2002 at Harry S. Truman VA Hospital, Columbia. Mr. Stone was born June 7, 1915, 2002 in Cooper County, Mo. to William Edward and Bertha Ann Simmons Stone. He married Phyllis Ann Stone on Aug. 23, 1963 in Blackwater, Mo. She preceded him in death on July 20, 2000. He served honorably in the U. S. Army from 1940 to 1945 in the European Theatre during WW II earning five bronze stars, five silver stars and the European Victory Medal. Mr. Stone was a D-Day veteran. He was a member of the VFW No. 2442 in Eldon. He worked for F. M. Stamper Food Co. in Marshall for ten years, then for the Missouri State Highway Dept., retiring in 1977. He was a farmer in the Marshall area.

He is survived by three sons, William Stone of Olean, Mo. Leonard Stone of Clarksburg, Mo., and Phillip Stone of Tuscomb, Mo.; one brother, John Stone of Sturgeon, Mo.; four sisters, Jennie Hensgen of Racine, Wis., Margaret Gardner of Sedalia, Mary Renno of Marshall, Mo. and Rosa Shirley of Cameron, Mo.; and five grandchildren.
