History:

This cemetery recorded by Mrs. Estelle Snow, July 19, 1967 and updated through December 1984. This cemetery is on the "August Palmberg Farm", about four miles southeast of Bunceton, Missouri. It was owned by the Warfield Family during the Civil War; and is presently owned by Mr. Porter Harned.

In John S. Kelly's will of 1852 he stated his wish that stones, from his spring, might be hauled to this cemetery and used to build a wall around his grave, and the graves of his wife, Joanna, their daughter and two children. The wall was built and remained for many yeas. It since has been destroyed.

In an excerpt from an article in Rural Life Edition of the "Boonville Daily News" of 25 Jul 1986; there is mention of this cemetery. The author's grandmother had told her that "There were probably between 50 – 60 graves here during Civil War times." "Around 1920 – 1921, there were only 20 - 25 markers still standing."

It appears that the cemetery may be still standing inside a small of trees in the field.
