On the Estil Eichelberger Farm. East and near the residence; about 2 1/2 miles west of Bell Air, Missouri. From Bell Air, Missouri on Route 5 take the gravel road west about 1 mile, then northwest and west another 1/2 mile. Cross the Petite Saline Creek bridge south (left). This is the Eichelberger residence on the left hand side of the road. The Lowery land was on both sides of the road and it is not known just where the Lowery residence was located.
