History:

This cemetery is enclosed by a stone wall and an iron fence.

Thomas McMahan, Jr. was one of the original settlers in Lamine Township, coming in 1811. He served in Captain S Cooper's Militia during the War of 1812.

On 13 Apr 1997, Mrs. La Rue indicated that they have been restoring this old cemetery. Also that the one marker which was left in the Thomas McMahan, Sr. Cemetery has been moved to this place to preserve it.
