History:

There was, at one time a school here, the Bell Air Negro School; for the colored children of the neighborhood; dating back many years.

In 1913, the congregation of the Free-Will Baptists purchased one acre of land adjoining the school grounds, from Mr. Dan Hawkins, and built a church and established a cemetery. Sometime about the middle of this century, the church was abandoned, as the people of the congregation had either passed away or moved away.

The cemetery remains, descendants of the first members have built a new fence around it and each Memorial day a few come to visit and decorate the graves.

The church building still stands; the school building was torn down long ago and that piece of land reverted back to the farm of Mr. Emmett Watkins, from whom it was purchased.

The little church, which stood here near the burial plot, was destroyed by a grass fire some time ago; probably in the 1980s. On a very windy day a fire blew in from the south side of the Ravenswood Farms. The church has stood vacant for some years, perhaps 20 or 30 years since there had been a congregation and service there. The land is now owned by W. R. Mitzel and Sons Farms, Inc.

In 1987, Roy and Helen Mitzel placed a nice granite marker bearing the names of all those persons known to have been buried here. There had never been any markers placed at these graves. This site is protected by a fence and is cared for from time to time.
