History:

The land for this cemetery was given to Amanda nee' Morris Woods, wife of John C. Woods and first cousin of Nancy nee' White McCulloch, by her father, Hammond Morris.

On the east side of the cemetery, can be seen the remains of an old trail and to the north, near the creek is an old well, which stood in the yard of an Inn which was a stage coach stop in early times. From Johnson's "History of Cooper County Missouri".

Charles Woods was one of the first settlers of Kelly Township; thought to have been settled about 1818. He served in the War of 1812. General Charles Woods was for many years, the leading democratic politician of the township; he was a forceful speaker and a gentleman in every respect.

There are unmarked graves here and some only with foot stones with initials. It is thought that there were about twenty or more graves here.
